## Phonics/Spelling

Login to Phonics Play and play a game (Free access using the username march20 and password home). <https://new.phonicsplay.co.uk/resources>


- 'looked', 'called', 'asked' and 'laughed' are some of the words that children in Year 1 need to be able to read and spell. Can your child use these to write sentences?

Ask your child, 'What do the above words all end with?' (the suffix -ed)  
Ask your child to add -ed to these words- play, stay, jump, cook, talk, push, pull, walk, open. What happens to these words? Do we add -ed? Or does the word change? make, come, sing, cry, go, run, drink, and do. Talk about how adding -ed and those irregular words are in the past tense.

Use some of yesterday's words to write a sentence which includes either a -ed word or an irregular word. E.g. Yesterday, I walked through the dark forest with my happy family.

Remember each sentence must begin with a **capital letter** and end with a **full stop**. Use **adjectives** in each sentence.

**English:** This week we will be looking at the Lighthouse Keepers Lunch book. - Can you write a description of the setting below? Remember to punctuate your sentences and use adjectives!

Below are some activities you can do with your child:

Organise the coins on your table into pence and pounds.  
Can you name each coin?



Write down the value of each coin.



- Ask children to use their knowledge of place value to match coins with equivalent values. For example, ten 1 pence coins is equivalent to one 10 pence coin.

Using coins children make links to times tables. What do they notice?



Use or draw coins to show the given amounts.

- 10p in 5p coins.
- 50p in 5p coins.
- 50p in 10p coins.
- 40p in 5p coins.
