Make your own Snakes and Ladders game

What you need

A large piece of card (you could use a cereal box or other box)

Ruler

Pen and pencil

Colouring pens

Pipe cleaners – or more card to draw snakes

Lolly pop sticks

Something for counters

Dice

Glue

If you don't have pipe cleaners why not draw and colour in your own snakes, you could copy your favourite snakes or design your own.



Bubble snakes.

You need:



1. Use a pair of scissors to cut off the bottom of a water bottle:



2. Stretch out the sock and slide it over the open end of the water bottle.



3. Stretch it out so it opens up completely over the water bottle:



4. And then fold it back. Folding it back will keep it snug on the bottle, and it will make it easy to take apart if you are using a good pair of socks that you plan to reuse afterwards.



5. In a small bowl, mix some washing up liquid with a small amount of water and then dip the end of the bottle and sock into it.



6. Then blow on the mouth piece of the bottle to make the bubbles.



The harder you blow, the better your bubbles will turn out. Blowing hard makes a snake. Blowing lightly kind of makes a big ball of bubbles on the end of the bottle.
