Art and Design:

Design your own Park for Bearpark – think about a park you know well. What facilities does it have? How do children and adults use it? Design your own park! Think about all the elements needed for the community, and what extra ideas you think would make it extra special. You could draw a diagram and label it.

Design you own wordsearch – About Japan. Or a topic of your choice! You could include key words about Japan that you have learnt from your research, such as Kyoto, Mount Fuji and kimono.

Computing:

Write a story about ANYTHING. Free choice!

Either on Microsoft Word on a computer, or in Notes on an iPad. You could *change fonts* for different paragraphs, use **bold** and *italics* to emphasise important words or phrases, and include a page border.

If you're feeling brave, use Microsoft Powerpoint on a computer, or Keynote on an iPad, to split the story into different sections, where each slide is a different paragraph. Play about with the fonts, colours and background to suit the 'mood' of the paragraph. For example, if it's a scary section, you could have white text on a dark background.
